Naulakha ~ Naulakha, Rudyard Kipling's home, is fully furnished for 8, includes 3 full baths, complete kitchen, comfortably cozy library, and basement w/d. Abandoned for over 40 years, it has been fully restored to his design and much of the furniture is original, in fact, chosen by the Kiplings. Lounge in his library or bathe in his tub. The grounds offer a clay tennis court, rhododendron tunnel, forested hillsides, and two marble benches installed on the ridge where he would develop his next story.

Kipling's Carriage House ~ Built in the 1890's for Kipling's carriage, then converted to housing for his staff, this house welcomes you with the warmth and richness of its wood paneling, a kitchen with glass cupboards on one side and forest views on the other. It sleeps 4, has a full bathroom, complete spacious kitchen, warm & comfortable living room, and ping pong & laundry facilities in the basement. This 18th century home is nestled among the trees offering the feeling of having lived in a cabin, with comfort...

Sugarhouse on the Scott Farm ~ Located on the historic Scott Farm, the 1915 Sugarhouse was the site of maple syrup production for decades. Maple sugaring goes back centuries as Native Americans recognized this forest gift, called "Indian molasses". Our romantic and cozy Sugarhouse for two is in a rural & private setting, just minutes from Brattleboro and all of the attractions of Southern Vermont.

Amos Brown House ~ Built in 1802 of brick fabricated on site, later expanded to include a summer kitchen, porch, barn, and 4-seater outhouse, this comfortable well-lived in property sleeps 6, has two full bathrooms, complete kitchen, & cozy living room. In the early 1900's, an order of the Carthusian monks occupied the property for nearly 20 years. The house sits in the middle of 30 acres of mixed hardwood and hay meadows; wonderful playground for dogs and walks along the maze of forested trails.

Dutton Farmhouse ~ Offers a broad vista over the Scott Farm apple orchards, and beyond. The main house was built around 1840, sleeps 8, has two full bathrooms, one half bathroom, a complete kitchen, easy access to forest trails and abandoned apple orchards. The house is curiously made up of assembled parts and was used as seasonal housing for apple pickers for over 30 years. From the Dutton Farmhouse not a single house can be seen across a view of many miles.
